▷ Vernissage

application and intention	<p>A vernissage can be used to present group results- mostly those of similar contents. (If you have different contents, you need to equip every member with a worksheet to note down the important information. The students need to develop communication skills (explain and develop their ideas) and talk freely in front of others to a topic.</p>
types if vernissages	<p>the group members form a new group and walk through the classroom in their new group to look at the different posters/exhibitions and talk about their work once they have reached it.</p> <p>Silent vernissage- every students strolls around the classroom and has a look at all the presentations by himself.</p>
how to do a vernissage	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The posters which are going to be presented are hung in the classroom.2. Every group member joins a new group (now in every new group is one member of every group at least.)3. The groups "visit" every poster clockwise in the classroom.4. Every group member presents and explains his poster/work to the other students of his new group and answers questions.
control	<p>A worksheet with information to be filled in can be distributed, so the students have to note down information.</p>
